

Here are the steps to install JMP on your computer.

This installation process was tested on a laptop using Windows XP. If you are using Vista or Windows 7, the process for unzipping the file may be slightly different. If you need help, ask your instructor or the Hub.

These instructions are for Windows (or Mac users using Windows Emulators). Mac instructions follow.

1) The installation file that you will be downloading is rather large (~300 Mb). It took about 9 minutes to download over WiFi on a home DSL line. You are encouraged to use a LAN connection at CSU or a high-speed DSL (or Cable modem) connection. If the download says it's going to take much longer, cancel the download and try again at a different time, as we have a lot of students who will be installing this program.

2) Go to <http://kahuna.clayton.edu/jmp/> You'll see a window pop up that asks for a User Name and Password. The following are case sensitive:

User Name: Math1231

Password: ILikeStats!

3) Click on the link for the Windows Installation file. Save that file to your computer. It doesn't matter where, so long as you can find it later. The Desktop is a good place to save it to.

4) Wait a while while the file downloads.

5) Once the file has downloaded completely to your computer, you'll need to unzip it. If you're using Windows, right-click on the link and select "Extract All". The Extraction Wizard should start up. Click Next to start the extraction process. Click Next again to accept the extraction directory, and then click Next yet again to start the extraction. Click Finish when the process is completed.

6) Go to the Extraction folder (which will be called "Windows", unless you changed it). Double-click on the icon called "Launch".

7) Windows may pop up a window asking if you really want to run the program. Click Run if that happens.

8) You should now see a window with the JMP logo with the options to Install JMP 8, View Installation Notes, etc. Click on "Install JMP 9". Follow through the installation program. When it finishes, you'll have a full version of JMP 8 installed on your computer.

9) Select "Exit" from the menu once the installation is complete.

10) You can now delete the zip file that you downloaded as well as the directory that the zip files were extracted to. Since the files are pretty large, it is recommended that you delete them.

11) You should see a JMP 8 icon on your desktop. To run JMP, simply double-click the icon.

Mac Instructions:

1) The installation file that you will be downloading is rather large (~300 Mb). It took about 9 minutes to download over WiFi on a home DSL line. 3) Click on the link for the Mac Installation file. Save that file to your computer. It doesn't matter where, so long as you can find it later. The Desktop is a good place to save it to.

4) Wait a while while the file downloads.

5) Locate the file on your computer, Double click on it to extract the files.

6) Run JMP-9-Installer. Follow through the installation program. When it finishes, you'll have a full version of JMP 9 installed on your computer.

7) Select "Exit" from the menu once the installation is complete.

8) You can now delete the zip file that you downloaded as well as the directory that the zip files were extracted to. Since the files are pretty large, it is recommended that you delete them.

9) You should see a JMP 9 icon on your desktop. To run JMP, simply double-click the icon.
